Legislative: Brian

Greetings, Will County ABATE!

Well, anyone who thought that getting rid of Blagojevich would usher in a new spirit cooperation and bipartisanship in Springfield must be thoroughly disgusted by now. No capital funding bill; threats of mass layoffs and cuts in social services, law enforcement, school funding; you name it - same gridlock and stalemate as before. Gov. Quinn can't get any support for his income tax hike and the accusing the Democrats are Republicans of blocking spending bills. They conveniently ignore the fact that Democrats have enough votes to pass anything they want, IF they could ever agree on anything. Two bills of interest to us did get passed by both houses, however. HB071 forbids the use of "personal communication devices" in a moving vehicle. In other words, NO TEXTING. Use of GPS's or navigation devices is allowed and commercial or law enforcement vehicles are exempted. HB072 -Prohibits use of cell phones in school zones or highway construction zones unless the phone is hands-free.

Rep. William Black is still trying to

get HB073 (the Negligent Vehicular Homicide bill) moving. He hopes to get an amended version passed during the fall session. Rep. Emily McAsey (85th Dist.) is a cosponsor - so it wouldn't hurt to call her and voice your support for the bill.

While I'm on the subject of negligence, you've probably heard that the Lake County State's Attorney hasn't brought any charges against Lora Hunt yet. She's the driver who was painting her nails while driving and killed motorcyclist Anita Zaffke. The State's Attorney is trying to see if it's possible to file more serious charges than failure to reduce speed. If he charges her with a less serious offense and she pleads guilty, that's it, case closed. He's really trying to make more serious charges stick.

As for federal legislation, the House Transportation Committee is still drafting the Transportation Funding Bill. Chairman Jim Oberstar has met with the MRF concerning this bill, and it's going to be a biggie - about \$550 billion over five years. The problem is, they only have Gasoline Tax receipts for about \$250 billion and the authors of the bill don't want to resort to borrowing or deficit

spending. Say what?!? A self-funded bill? I don't think there's been one of those in 40 years! But seriously, the current bill expires on Sept. 30th, so there will no doubt be extensions to the current funding until the new bill gets voted on. One of the ideas to come up with the money for the new bill is a VMT tax (vehicle miles traveled). Every vehicle would have an onboard computer that

would "talk" to the pump and calculate the miles driven since the last fill-up. Larger vehicles would pay more and lighter vehicles (like motorcycles) would pay less. Of course, the technology needed to do this would be very expensive, so they would need to figure out a way to pay for it. Keep up the fight!
